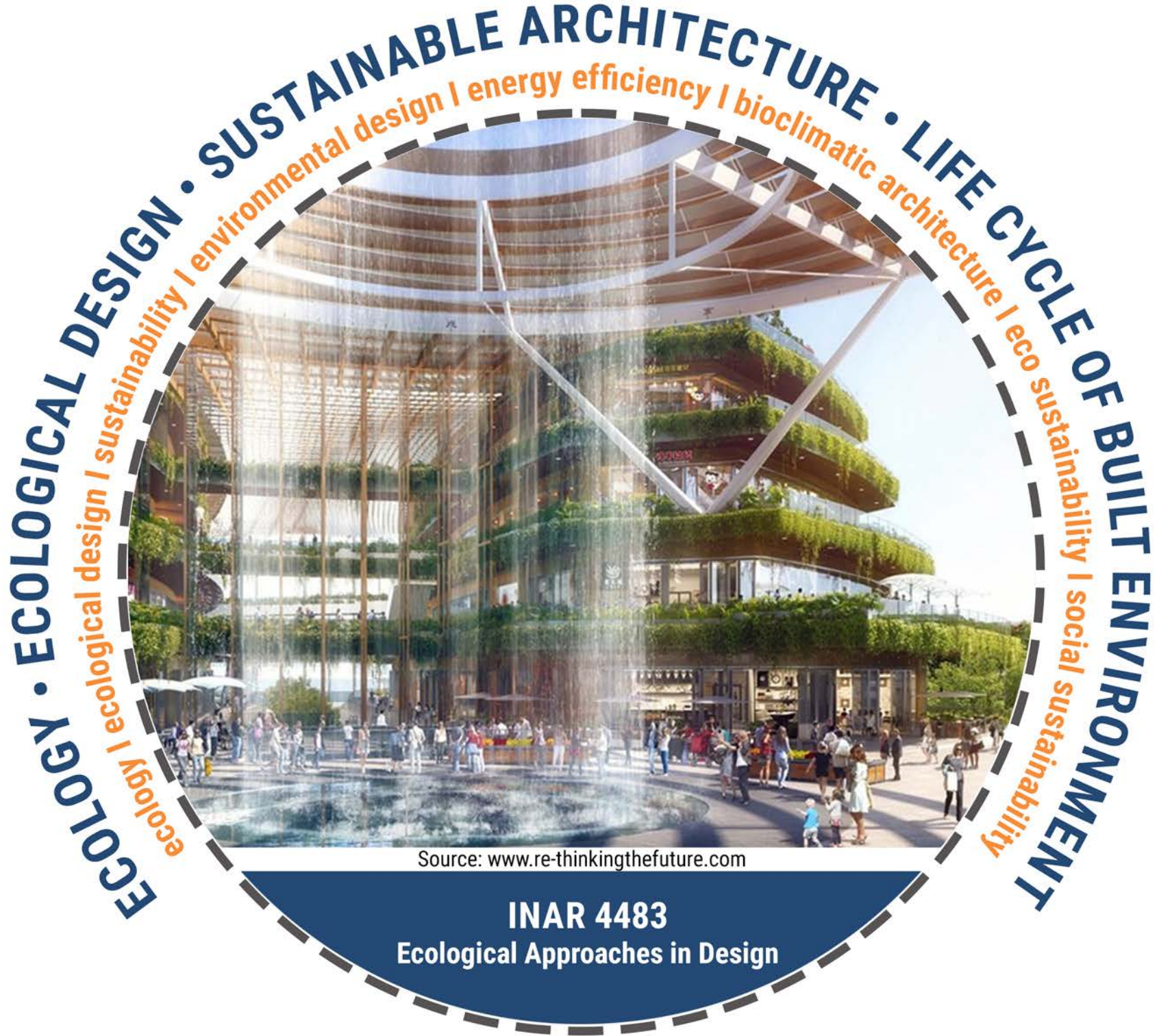

At the end of this course; students will be able to understand the interrelationship between nature and human interventions on design research and practice. It introduces design strategies based on integration of ecology, ecosystems, community, environment and their effects on life cycle of built environment. Topics such as bio-mimicry, bioclimatic comfort, energy efficiency of buildings and condensation, and ecology and environmental performance of materials are covered. The aim is to produce design products by enhancing the health, safety and welfare of human beings and ecosystems at all scales (local, regional and global), by using minimal resources and by taking advantage of ecological organisms and environmental conditions. The aim of the course is to apply ecological strategies in any design project, to reduce environmental effects.

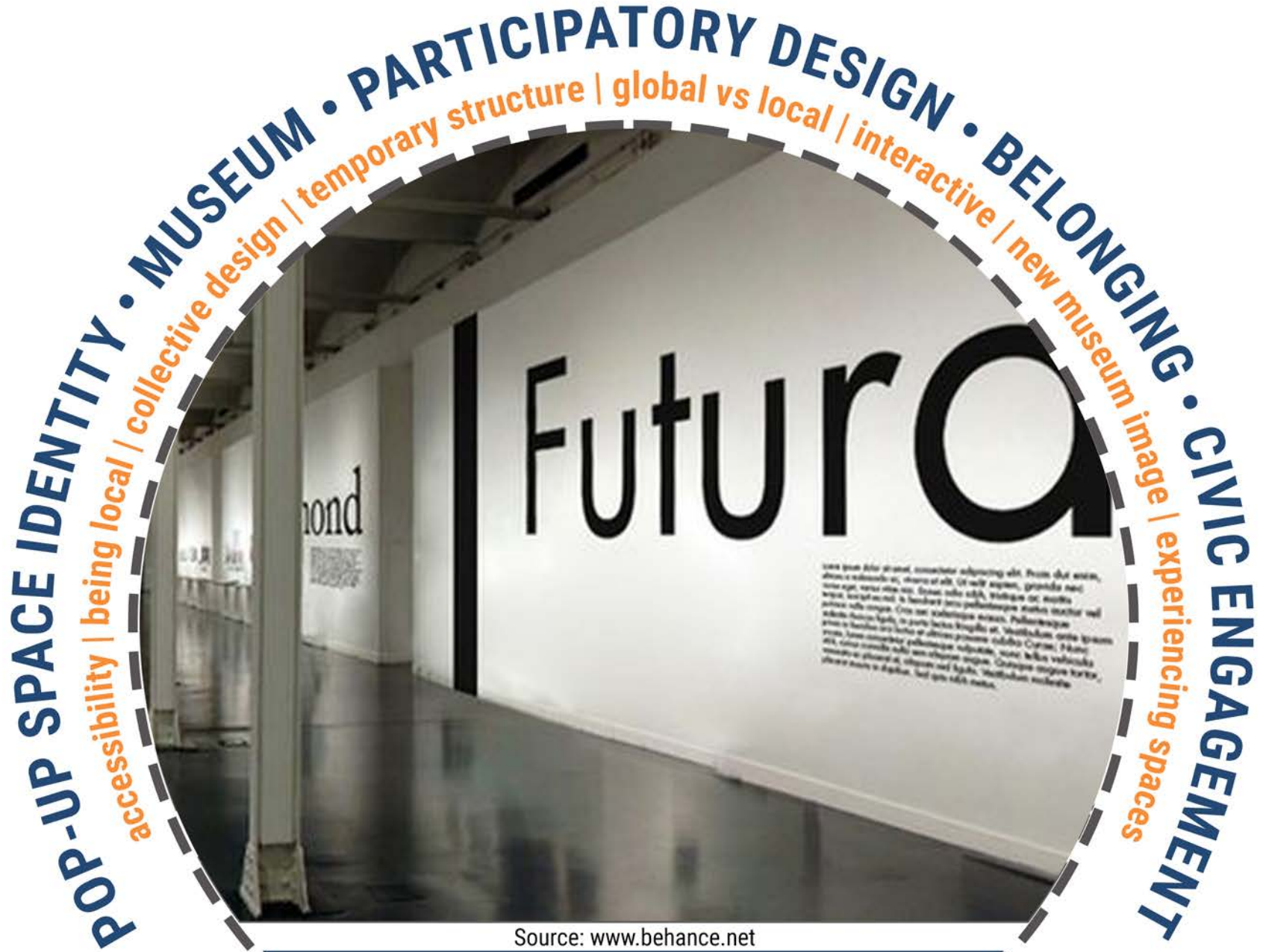
